GIFT AID

Just a reminder to those members who have completed Gift Aid Forms - to be eligible for us to claim back the 25% from HMRC for your membership, you **must** make the payment from your **own personal bank account** or your **joint account**.

Unfortunately last year we had to reject some claims as their fees had been paid from someone else's (usually their partners) bank account so were not eligible. Your cooperation would be greatly appreciated.

For members who have not completed a Gift Aid form, we would encourage you to do so as it is a valuable source of income for us. To be eligible you need to pay UK Income tax and complete a form which can be found on the website, or copies are always available on the Membership desk. We claim the money back annually from HMRC so there is nothing more for you to do. Many thanks!

OFFICER & COMMITTEE VACANCIES

You will have seen that our AGM is looming ever closer and we will be looking for new members to join our Committee. Now I know most of you will just skip over this article, but please just pause for a moment and have a read as it is very important.

VISITING INTERESTING PLACES IN ESSEX GROUP

Members of the Visiting Interesting Places in Essex Group visited a hidden gem in October. Have you ever visited Purfleet? Did you know Purfleet had such an interesting past?

We discovered this during our visit to the Purfleet Heritage & Military Centre which is housed in Magazine No.5 built in 1760 and is the last remaining Magazine of 5 that made up the Royal Magazines for Gunpowder on the banks of the River Thames.

During our guided tour we discovered that such well known people as Benjamin Franklin and Captain Cook had visited and historical vessels such as HMS Warrior, HMS Bounty, HMS Beagle, the Endeavour and Resolution had all been supplied by the Magazine.

The Grade 1 listed building houses a truly extensive range of artefacts and exhibitions covering local history, WW1, WW2, Colonial War, Trafalgar, RAF, Royal & Merchant Navy and the way we lived. It is also the second official museum for the Ghurkha regiment.
