The Archaeology Group started off in May, 2009. So far, we have examined Iron Age and Roman pottery from local estuary mud, visited Hadleigh Castle to see if we could learn anything new, taken part in a summer excavation organized by a local archaeological society (Rochford Hundred Field Archaeology Group) and carried out our own excavation at a property bordering Hockley Woods.

The Hockley excavation has drawn us into quite an investigation, linking the house to local grand residences Bullwood Hall (before it was a prison) and Whitbreds, and to large 19th century landowners. But why was it built? As part of the quest to solve the mysteries thrown up, we are meeting local historical author Lesley Vingoe.

We are also trying to find a copy of the very rare book "Recollections of Southend-on-Sea and Neighbourhood" written by Miss Augusta Saumarez Tawke in 1915 and published in 1934. Can anybody help?
