

Hatfield House Country Fair Friday, 19th August, 2011

A trip has been arranged to Visit the Country Fair at Hatfield House which is held annually. The cost of the visit will be £20 and will include entry to the Country Fair and driver's gratuity. The Fair gives a taste of the Countryside and includes a Food Marquee, Celebrity Chef Demonstrations, Steam Traction Engines, Traditional Breed Animals, Shooting, Fishing, Archery, Arena Events and lots of stalls to tempt you to spend your money. Throughout the day transport will be running to the House where there is a restaurant and some very nice small shops.
