FLAMENCO DANCING

You may remember that just before Christmas an email arrived from Marion Allen giving details that the University of Essex at Southend were offering three Flamenco dancing lessons for beginners at a cost of £12 for each lesson. The venue was an old church in Nelson Road, Southend-on-Sea where I duly arrived on the 16th January for the first lesson. Alas, the first arrivals were not golden oldies but young teenagers, although some more golden oldies did arrive later making me feel better!! Mind you the registration area was as crowded as Liverpool St Station in the rush hour. Our teacher, Sandra la Espuelita, was dressed in beautiful Spanish red and black traditional costume. She told us she had started dancing 25 years ago, turned professional 23 years ago and has been teaching for the last 10 years. She began the session by teaching us the Fandango. The lessons were excellent but very complicated. It was a joy to watch Sandra dancing by herself, swishing her skirts and rattling the castanets. She told us a little of the history of Flamenco dances which began way back in time with the gipsies from Rajasthan, and travelled down with the Moors into Spain.

The Moors were later persecuted and many were thrown out of Spain but the dance and music were kept alive as an expression of rebellion. Although they were downtrodden they could express their feelings through their culture. 'You can persecute me, but you can't take my soul - my soul is my dance and music." When Franco was in power he allowed anyone to dance the Flamenco dances for the tourists. It has now returned to the gipsies and their descendants. Out of courtesy the dancers always refrain from stamping too loudly so that you can hear the guitar music. The musicians who played the guitars for us (again excellent) run Southend Flamenco classes at The Storehouse, Coleman Street, Southend on Sea. For more information please phone Linda Clarke on 01702 465244. Quakers and their quiet and contemplative talk expressed their inner belief of peace and kindness.

The third of our talks was given by Imam Iftiqar UI Haq and we were struck not by the differences but of the many links between the Muslim and Christian faith. Naturally there are differences and we were able to question and explore some of these differences with him.

Our last talk, on the 7th of February, was given by Otto Deutz. He talked not only of his faith of Judaism, but also of his experience at the age of 7 years in 1938 of being sent from Vienna to England by his mother to ensure his safety from persecution. Otto's father had at that time been deported to a Labour Camp and he never returned home. Once in England, Otto was fostered by a very kind Christian family in the North of England where he stayed until he was 15. Although he has since visited Vienna, Essex has been his home for many years and is where he is happy. Otto's talk and the presentation of his few family photographs was uplifting as well as sad and thought provoking. His faith remains strong.

The series has been informative, interesting and thought provoking and our intention is to arrange follow up visits for those who attended as we have been invited both to the Mosque in Westcliff and the Synagogue in Southend. We hope to arrange a further series of talks in 2012.
