The Story So Far....

POTTED HISTORY OF RAYLEIGH U3A

Have you ever wondered how our Rayleigh U3A came about? I have, so I started looking into the last 10 years since it was formed, talking to some of the founder members and looking through records.

It was only due to a small group of people that it has become one of the most successful U3As. This is thanks to Steering Committee Chairman Marian Allen and Committee Members Brian Kersey, Irene Carter, Fred Carter, Sue Taylor, Terry Taylor, George and Barbara Dunmore, Frank and Doreen Bodey, David and Janet Carlton, Betty Herbert and Maureen Huntly. Many of these are still active members and continue to contribute to the success of Rayleigh U3A.

The idea to start the Rayleigh U3A came from Marian Allen, a U3A member for 19 years. She asked a group of 13 interested people to join her to form a steering group in the summer of 2007 when they applied for a grant to help set up the U3A from Essex Community Foundation. A grant of £1350 was awarded in September 2007 enabling the inaugural meeting to be held on 5th October 2007 at the Holy Trinity Hall with 69 people attending and becoming members.

Membership grew each month and by February 2008 there were 180 members and 15 groups. Meetings were held monthly on Fridays at the Holy Trinity Hall.

Unfortunately, Marian had to step down from her position of chairing the steering group due to ill health and asked Maureen Huntly to step into her shoes. Marian remained active over the next few years accepting the title of Honorary Founder Member of the Rayleigh U3A until she sadly passed away in December 2015. In February 2016 Marian was added to the U3A National Roll of Honour for her outstanding contribution to the U3A movement.

The membership fee in 2007 was £14.00 and as the membership grew the fee was increased to £20 in 2009 as it remains so today.

The first AGM was held on 1st February 2008 and monthly meetings continued at Holy Trinity Hall.

A new sound system was purchased in October 2009 plus additional exhibition boards, and later a screen, laptop and projector were added which helped greatly to advertise the groups and events to benefit the members attending monthly meetings. By this year there were 46 groups and the membership had risen to 311.

In November 2009 Pete Huntly applied for charitable status for Rayleigh U3A which was granted in March 2010 and recognition subsequently obtained from HMRC to enable Gift Aid to be claimed later that year.

Chairman Maureen Huntly and her committee were instrumental in setting up the Rayleigh Grange U3A with an inaugural meeting in May 2009 and the Hullbridge U3A in July 2010.

The monthly meetings of Rayleigh U3A were moved to the Mill Hall in January 2011 due to the increased number of members of 375 and were held on the first Thursday of each month as the Mill Hall was already booked on Friday afternoons.

The Rayleigh U3A helped establish the setting up of a further two more U3As, Hadleigh Castle in November 2010 and Canvey Island April 2011.

At the AGM in April 2011 there were no nominations for Chairman, so Maureen Huntly agreed to stay on for another year.

By 2012 there were 56 groups and in April of that year David Sheffield was voted in as Chairman.

At the 2014 AGM Pete Huntly stood as Chairman and the membership had risen to 400. Study days, educational talks, holidays and coach trips became very popular, offering a broader spectrum to an already varied calendar of events available to the members.

In April 2017 David Fryer-Kelsey stood as Chairman and we now have 63 groups and 457 members.

New ideas to bring the Rayleigh U3A into the 21st century have been introduced: Facebook group page, change of bank, updating the display boards at the monthly meetings, new groups formed and coffee mornings to enable new members to integrate into our U3A.

There will also be new ways to pay annual subscriptions to make life easier for Officers involved in this job.

The aim of the current Officers and Committee is to ensure the continued success of the Rayleigh U3A.

EDUCATIONAL EVENTS FOR RAYLEIGH U3A

The ethos of the U3A is to enable members to continue to research, explore and learn about new or little-known subjects.

When we decided to introduce 'Talks for All' we looked for a wide variety of Speakers from herbalism, the Chairman of Southend Hospital Trust, what it was like to ride across America on a bike to the evolving London Underground System and the Editor of the Echo newspaper and many many more.

We have organised Speakers Lunches inviting many interesting Speakers from Dr. Lewis Dartnell talking about his research book on how we would cope if there was an apocalypse to Lord Petre, Lord Lieutenant of Essex, who told us about being the Queen's Representative. Explorer Fran Sandham told of his epic journey across Africa. Members have sat enthralled to listen and learn about the work choices, the opportunities of some, or the exciting adventures enjoyed by others.

Study Days were introduced to widen the field of choice of Speakers on a given subject. Members were fascinated with the subject of Family History in 2011. We enlightened our audience with The Festival of Words that included a poet, folk music and famous author Barbara Erskine. The Victorian London Study Day in 2013 covered life in those times, progress of medicine and a visit from a pearly King and Queen.

At the Significant Anniversaries Study Day, we learned about Magna Carta, Battle of Waterloo, Battle of Britain and The History of Rayleigh. Our last Study Day was entitled Capability Brown, who had a vision of how the beautiful English countryside could be enhanced. Greg Allen from Writtle Agricultural College talked about the training of today's landscape gardeners.

All these wonderful events and the many Speakers involved have brought a great deal of pleasure to the members of Rayleigh U3A. Pete and I have worked as a team alongside people who have helped us over the years including Marian, Pat, John, Chris, Dave, Irene, Fred, Joan, Alan, Sylvia, Janet, Terry, Sheila and others not forgetting those who helped with the refreshments to enhance these wonderful events. Thank you to Wendy Edwards for being my Committee Representative for the last year.

Our last Event is the Jane Austen Literary Lunch on 21st March at Saxon Hall with the Hon. Sec. of the Jane Austen Society speaking about this author who in her time wrote ground breaking books which now are historically accurate of her time. I have been helped by members of Book Group 2.

I look back on my U3A journey over ten years from Chair to Social and Educational Events Coordinator with pleasure and pride and will now enjoy being a group member and hand over the reins to Elaine Woodcock and Val Skam. I wish them success and look forward to being in the audience at their future events.

GIFT AID

Thank you to all those members who have already completed a Gift Aid Declaration.

As a reminder to take part in the Gift Aid Scheme you must pay an amount of Income Tax and/or Capital Gains Tax for each tax year at least equal to the tax, which we as a registered charity, will claim from HM Revenue and Customs on your annual subscription. In our case this is £5.

You can cancel your declaration at any time by notifying us, and should do so, if your circumstances change and you no longer pay sufficient tax.
