SECRETARY'S NOTES U3A EAST OF ENGLAND CONFERENCE

Marian Allen and Terri Gouldsmith represented Rayleigh U3A at the East of England Conference held at St Neots, Cambridgeshire on the 29th September with approximately 50 representatives from 25 U3A Groups ranging in size from under 300 to over 900 members

An idea put forward by Jill Moore from Leigh U3A in order to celebrate the Olympics was an Estuary Walk co-ordinated between different U3A groups. Some groups would spread their walk over 2-3 days. Others would do about 2 miles in a chain between Shoebury and the Olympic site passing on the baton from one U3A link in the chain to the next. We thought it sounded a very good idea.

A question raised by one member was whether we should employ paid tutors, bearing in mind the lack of adult education facilities. The Chairman of the Third Age Trust, Ian Searle, and Founder Member, Eric Midwinter, were strongly against this happening and said that if we did so it set a dangerous precedent. We are a self-help organisation and our strength comes with sharing our knowledge and learning together.

The keynote speech of the Conference was made by Eric Midwinter who reminded us of U3A principles which has been adhered to since its inception. In short, these are that there should be no education without enjoyment. Citizens invent their own destiny. Everybody has something to offer. People are given the confidence to bring their skills to the party. To my mind these are a good set of principles and do not suffer from being repeated occasionally.
