

A FURTHER RECOMMENDATION FROM BOOK GROUP TWO

A true story of one woman's struggle to keep her child and win freedom for them both.

This book was harrowing, but compelling reading. If you didn't know that eventually Betty and her daughter did get out of Iran it would have been a page turning thriller. The terrible position she found herself in and the mental and physical cruelty she received from her once loving husband and his family were unbelievable. A film has been made but the book reveals just how appallingly women were treated in Iran at that time and this comes over so much better than in the film.



It was hard to take in that her husband, who was a doctor and had lived in America for twenty years could take his wife and young daughter to live with his family and expect them to accept the totally squalid conditions there. Betty desperately wanted to leave and return to America with her daughter but seemed blocked every way she turned. The Iranians who did help her were extremely brave as the Americans were hated and blamed for all troubles in Iran. The details of her actual escape to get across the Iranian border into Turkey and then to America were hard to imagine anyone could endure, let alone with a small child.

The book was written in conjunction with William Hoffer an American who has written other books and film scripts based on real life stories so you wonder if parts were embellished to make it a marketable book and film. Also not all Iranian families live in the squalor of the Mahoodys.

This lady when she eventually got back to America has spent her life lecturing on living with different cultures and is concerned with an organisation to protect children of bi-cultural marriages. We felt that this is a book that should be read.

Gardening Corner

Have you noticed how well the berrying shrubs like the Holly (Ilex) and Pyracantha have performed this year? Among the many Hollies, Ilex J.C. Van Tol, is a spineless variety and female, does not require a pollen partner and this year is one of the best I have known.



Pyracantha (Golden Charmer) has yellow/orange berries beloved by Blackbirds when ripe in winter. All in all, apples and pears and most fruits have performed well. Hollies and Pyracantha make good evergreen hedges and respond well to pruning. The recent outbreak of Box Blight which has devastated long established hedges and topiary has no known cure or regrowth.

As soon as fruiting is finished, it is time to start pruning apples and pears, but NOT plums. Remove any long non-fruited growths or overcrowded branches completely, with the rest down to two or three buds. A dressing of Lime, which will disappear during the wet of winter, is also recommended.

Autumn fruiting raspberries (Autumn Bliss is a good one) are also having a bumper year. Pruning of this variety should be complete removal of this year's growth (down to ground level) soon after fruiting, which could be November!

Finally, a touch of late colour - Zinnias which are annual plants, easy to grow from seed with a little bottom heat, which flower in a wide range of unusual colours. Long lasting when cut, or enjoy outside until the first frosts.
