Dear Member

We held a Special General meeting on Thursday 5th October at Mill Hall where we considered and voted on several changes to the current Constitution of Rayleigh U3A. These changes were primarily designed to make it easier and more efficient for the Membership Secretary to handle renewals and new members' applications in the New Year period and to help the Treasurer to deal with the Bank. The effect on the members is that the subscription is due and payable in full by 1st April instead of 1st February. We now offer the facility to pay subscriptions by Standing Order or Bank Transfer. Details will be sent out with the renewal notice. The Committee have also agreed that the AGM will take place in May instead of April.

Our Questionnaire Competition was won by Irene Calver and she can now enjoy a traditional afternoon tea for two at Squires Coffee Shop in Rayleigh. There was quite a good response to the questionnaire and we are publishing an article in the Newsletter.

June Jennings is standing down as joint editor of the newsletter – many thanks June, for the hard work you have done to give us an interesting read every two months. Sheila Farrant will continue and will be joined by Viv Smith. Please support them by supplying articles or comments or suggestions.

David Clarke has worked the projector at our monthly meetings since our U3A started and would now like to have some help. Twenty-one of our group visited St Peter's Church in Thundersley in September. It is fascinating in that it shows the original church built between 1225 and 1230 and the newer extension, completed in 1966.


An original church stood on the site in 1120 but on Christmas Day 1209 it was burnt down. A few of the original Norman parts were saved and can be seen today.


The 'Old Church' had a tower built in 1588 to carry the bells, and its beams

are made of ships timbers salvaged during that period. One of the bells was given to the church by Robert Mot in 1588 to commemorate the victory over the Spanish Armada, the other is of unknown origin. A third bell was donated in 1928.



The nave is early 13th century with the roof replaced in the 15th century and is of the braced collar-beam type with two king-post trusses.
