Prior to his election to Parliament, Wes served as Deputy Leader and Cabinet Member for Health & Well-being for the London Borough of Redbridge. Wes comes from a working-class family and read history at Selwyn College, Cambridge. He is a former President of the National Union of Students.

DO YOU WANT TO HELP MONITOR LOCAL AIR QUALITY?

We Care for Our Air is a project by Redbridge Council to help improve local air quality. We will provide everything required for monitoring and regularly share the results with Redbridge residents. You can watch <u>this short video</u> to see how the monitoring works in practice. The air quality monitoring will run until the end of September 2024.

This requires a monthly commitment of a few minutes swapping your air tube which you affix to a lamppost outside your house, plus time to collect the new air tube which you will collect each month from a participating library (list below). You will be given a list of swap over dates.
