STROLLERS WALKING GROUP

A group of 14 Striders met in the grounds of Conisbrough Castle on Monday 16th October for a walk in the Conisbrough and Denaby area. It was a chilly day with some nice sunny periods and fortunately the rain kept away. Given the rain over the past few weeks we were fortunate that the going underfoot was very good and we completed the 8 miles in about 4 hours.

The route followed the high ridge south of the River Don through an area called the Crags which had a number of wooden information posts giving historical details about the area. The plethora of pathways in the Crags area, most which don't appear on OS maps, made navigation difficult and we took a couple of wrong turnings but eventually made our way by a good path to Old Denaby. From here we crossed the River Don and the adjacent canal and then followed the canal side eastwards for a mile or so before heading north east to join the Trans Pennine Trail. We left this near the remains of the former Earth Centre - which is now and outdoor centre for schools - crossing back to the south bank of the Don before winding our way back to the castle.

Many thanks to Liz and Marion for leading the walk and to Harry for back marking. Thanks also to everyone who attended and contributed to a great days walking in a very interesting area.

For those interested in popular music trivia Conisbrough was the birth place of Tony Christie (born Anthony Fitzgerald 25 04 43) famous for the song 'Is This the Way to Amarillo?' - he must have been struggling to find the place travelling from Conisbrough!
