#### **NEW HISTORY GROUPS**

We had our first 'proper' meeting this month when we looked at the history of how humans (and others) have made music since the Old Stone Age, some 60,000 years ago. From Neanderthal flutes (pretty much like a recorder!) to virginals and from Grecian lyres and lutes to self playing pianos, we followed the trail of woodwind, stringed and percussion instruments right through to today's synthesisers and other electronic instruments.

Along the way we also looked at a hydraulic organ complete with keyboard from the Greeks dating back 2,500 years and met the Persian engineers that automated it over a thousand years ago – a technique not reinvented until the 19<sup>th</sup> C.

Next month's topic, entitled 'Aftermath'

illuminates an altogether darker episode in human history. The surrender of Germany took place on Monday, May 7<sup>th</sup> 1945 and VE Day was proclaimed on the 8<sup>th</sup> of May. This was, however, not the end of the misery for millions of people. We'll be looking at the forced migrations, continuing battles and starvation that marked the following couple of years and how decisions taken then are still causing conflict and uncertainty today.

If you're interested in history that isn't preoccupied with regal family squabbles or the dusty houses of the aristocracy then come along and join us.
