Astronomy Group

We have continued to meet on a monthly basis. Since the New Year we have met to discuss Mars which was at its nearest point in its orbit to Earth in December and the satellites which are now orbiting our planet. We considered how the large numbers of satellites are putting space travellers at risk because of collisions and how astronomical research is made more difficult by their presence. We have been in touch with the Royal Astronomical Society and have written to our local MP about this problem (there is a need to engage in negotiations at an international level on this question). Some of us have braved some rather chilly weather to look at the constellations which are in the sky at the moment. We also looked at planet Jupiter and the Orion Nebula through the telescope. Next month we will look at the work of the Herschell family and in May/June we will discuss the Realm of the Galaxies and spend some time observing them- on a warm spring evening when the skies are clear and the barbecue will be working again. *Brian Wignall*
