

Regarding external speakers, Jackie Depelle told us the fascinating story of a WW2 internee whose life she was able to piece together with only a name to start her off. Lorna Kinnaird guided us through an introduction to Scotland's people. The wonderful advantage of being able to invite these experts is that any one of us is able to ask questions relevant to our own research. Lorna in particular has offered to help various individual members.

On alternate months we have been meeting in person, and this gives us an opportunity to get to meet socially. At one such meeting members discussed their DNA adventures and shared their experiences of testing – some positive, others with unexpected outcomes and cautionary tales. Undoubtedly, one of the highlights was our October 'Show & Tell' meeting

at the Workhouse, when members brought in artefacts relating to their ancestors in the Armed Forces, and revealed the stories behind them. It was reassuring to see how many treasured possessions are being safeguarded for future generations.

On Thursday 28th March our speaker will be Sir Thomas Ingilby who will talk to us about 'The Ingilbys of Ripley Castle'.

"The talk charts the extraordinary challenges that this family has faced during the last 700+ years (and 27 generations) since our

move to Ripley. It is thought-provoking but rich in anecdote, illustrating how one family has variously been impacted by plague, religious persecution, two civil wars and a failed regicide conspiracy. Above all it's a tale of survival with messages that are as relevant in today's troubled world as they were at the time".

Sir Thomas does not use slides. "I am a storyteller who subliminally encourages the audience to imagine that they are present witnessing the scene that I am describing. The talk is rich in anecdote and anecdotes are so much better when related by a skilled raconteur".

The talk will last approximately 50 minutes followed by a refreshments break, after which Sir Thomas is willing to take as many questions as we can fire at him!

Sir Thomas refused our fee, as such, and will instead give the money to **Myeloma UK**. "Multiple Myeloma, sometimes referred to as cancer of the bone marrow, is an incurable blood cancer that kills 5,500 people a year: average life expectancy is six years from diagnosis and it's a horrible way to go – for the sufferer and their distraught family.

"Research has advanced our knowledge of the disease and the light at the end of the tunnel is closer than it was. Some of your members will have experienced MM within their family and circle of friends. With your group's assistance we can bring that light another step closer", he told us.

Refreshments will be available upon arrival, as well as at the interval. We collect £2 refreshment payment from each person attending, which goes directly to the club, in return for help-yourself unlimited tea/filter coffee – and biscuits.

The Rugby Club has plenty of free parking, comfortable seating and very good facilities in their modern clubhouse.
