Mills were the "New technology" of their time and the building of the Mill race must have been a great initiative, providing power for several mills from one source. It is believed that there was a mill in Ripon possibly as early as Saxon times and the maximum number of mills operating at one time was five – all grinding corn to a varying extent. 




# Theatre Visit Group – Arlene Coulson – dvrarlene@btinternet.com
