"The confessions of a country vicar"



Alan was born in Wigan and educated at the King's school Ely. He trained at Kelham Theological College and, since his ordination in Southwell Minster in 1965, he has served the whole of his ministry in Nottinghamshire.

He became a Canon of Southwell Minster in 1986.

A keen sportsman, Alan follows both Nottingham football clubs and is a former member of Nottinghamshire Cricket Club's General Committee.

Over the past 32 years Alan has donated over £100 000 to churches, charities and sporting organisations by means of his speaking fees.
