

It sounds like one not to miss!




Monthly Meeting

You may be aware that, amongst all the work that goes on behind the scenes to keep our u3a running smoothly, several volunteers work to maintain and extend the automation of our processes through IT systems, for the convenience of our members and volunteers and to keep our costs down.

We recently felt that we needed to expand the IT support team and I am pleased to say that, in response to the request in the March newsletter, we now have two additional volunteers, Mike Pearson and Ted Phillips, supporting our IT systems.

These systems include the Beacon membership system, the website, email accounts for the Committee, and some additional systems that have been developed and introduced by Bob Bennett, our Treasurer.

The latter include the Voting system, which many of us used for the recent AGM, the Online Applications system that allows people to join our u3a, and existing members to renew their membership, and an

Invoicing system used by some of our groups. Quite a few of us will also have used the new payment terminals that Bob has introduced to make it possible to pay for u3a activities, events and membership in a straightforward way by credit or debit card.

Mike and Ted join the existing members of the team, Vic Newland, Phil Grimley and me, bringing the team number to five. We aim to continue to provide a high level of support to all users of our information technology so that it is effective in helping you to do what you need to do, and only rarely should you have cause to 'curse the technology'!










Church Visits Group

THE CHURCH OF ST MARY THE VIRGIN, BOTTESFORD.

This church is often referred to as 'the Lady of the Vale'. Our group of 15 visited this very beautiful church in the Vale of Belvoir on Wednesday 8 June. We received a very warm welcome from Parish Administrator Pamela and had a very interesting talk and tour, inside and outside the church with guide John, who gave us a very good insight into the history of the church and the local area.

The church has stood at the heart of Bottesford for almost 900 years. It contains a stunning collection of the tombs and monuments of the Earls of Rutland spanning 400 years, 2 of them by Grinling Gibbons.

At 210 feet tall, the spire is one of the tallest village spires in England. . It also houses falcons and they can be viewed via a videolink from the ground.

Inside, the flower arrangers had been busy very tastefully decorating the church with lovely displays of flowers and jubilee regalia.

This is an amazing church, full of local history including a war memorial commemorating the dead of the 2 world wars, also a plaque commemorating the dead of 207 Squadron RAF Bottesford during WW2.

Everyone in our group thoroughly enjoyed this month's visit. They were quite surprised by what they experienced and would thoroughly recommend a visit.
