### The birth of Rutland u3a: March 1996

Twenty five years ago a group of enthusiastic people living in Rutland were looking for something to fill the gap left after retiring from an active professional working life. They wanted to make the most of their Third Age which is defined as -Time for yourself, freedom, recreation and leisure.

The University of The Third Age began in Toulouse in 1972 following a ruling in France that educational facilities were to be made available to all senior citizens.

The first u3a was set up in Cambridge in 1982 with no formal links to education and no government funding. The idea was for members to share knowledge and experience with each other. Physical as well as academic subjects were encouraged. Social activities being considered just as important as learning.

The planning meeting of The Rutland Third Age Group was held on Thursday 7th March 1996 at the Vale of Catmose College in Oakham. Among those present at that meeting was Philip Payne who was chairman of Stamford Third Age Group that had been founded in 1987.

Also present at that meeting was Peter Tunnicliffe, Vice Principal of Vale of Catmose College who offered a room in the college for the group to meet in and Cecil Parry who was a member of the u3a National Executive Committee. The then mayor of Oakham, Jean Stewart and two members of Voluntary Action Rutland, Kathy Braddock and Linda Baines also attended.

The first committee consisted of 6 people, one of them, Richard Davies, is still a member and well known to many of us for his great contribution to our u3a.

The group began with 25 members and initially met at The Vale of Catmose College. There were 7 groups, Ambling, Cookery, Flower Arranging, Starting in Painting, Conversational French, Literature and Bowling

The first speaker on Thursday April 4th was another well known member, Richard Adams.

We have so much to thank our founding members for,not least that they took the trouble to get Rutland u3a off to such a great start that has gone from strength to strength.


