Fifteen members (three new) of the Church Visiting Group visited St Peter and St Paul at Great Casterton The talk was given by the priest in charge Rev. Don McGarrigle.

The church is an attractive building, has a pretty churchyard and a separate church hall. There is an oak door to enter the church.

Part of the church which exists today is from the 13th century, but it has apparently developed from a 12th century building.

The church consists of a nave, north and south aisles, chancel, south porch and an unusual tower which was added later by building it within the nave. There is also a vestry which was added in the early 1980's.

There is a fine example of wall painting, red five-lobed flowers, at the east end of the north aisle.

The font is of an unusual square design with a lozenge pattern and dates from early 13th century. It has a flat oak, locked cover. This is used about six times a year.





There are three stained glass windows, one of Jesus Christ on the cross and one of St Peter and another of what was thought to be St Paul. However, it was later identified as St James, a bishop from the diocese of Peterborough.

The 18th-century wooden pulpit was originally painted blue and gold but in recent years has been returned to its natural colour, wood. It has a canopy to assist the natural acoustics.

The churchyard is entered through an arched war memorial remembering the dead of both World Wars.

In recent years members of the church have decided not to cut the grass in the churchyard. This is to promote the biodiversity and help people to reconnect with nature.

At the far end of the churchyard there is a large modern Church Hall which is used for church council meetings and for the community of Great Castleton.

The poet John Clare married Martha "Patty" Turner in the church in 1820.

The interesting talk was followed by tea/coffee and cake.
