Speaker - Nigel Lowey

Pickleball Taster Sessions


There are 2 tester / trial sessions booked for the Saturdays of 18th and 25th November from 10.30am to 12 noon at the Catmose Sports Centre.

Astronomy Group



On Wednesday 27th September, four members of the recently formed RU3a Astronomy Group set off on a day trip to visit Jodrell Bank, the original home of British Radio Astronomy, established in 1945 by Sir Bernard Lovell. Situated in Cheshire, a short drive from the M6, the trip took a little over two hours. The site contains a number of radio telescopes, but by far the most famous is the 250ft diameter main dish, finished in 1957. It's the third largest in the world and has made hugely significant contributions to research and understanding of meteoroids, quasars, pulsars and gravitational lensing. It was also highly effective at tracking space probes at the start of the space age.

The centre is well equipped and really interesting, with four pavilions to visit. The 'Space Pavilion' near the dish itself is filled with information about the essence of radio astronomy and how Jodrell Bank fits in to the global picture plus a variety of 'hands-on' experiments that children enjoy, to help them with scientific understanding. There is also a new 'First Light Pavilion' which has a wide ranging exhibition including details about Bernard Lovell himself and the 'Space Dome' showing films on a huge, domed ceiling - truly mind blowing. We were treated to the 'Apollo Story' and when the Saturn V lifted off, it was almost like being there!

All in all a very worthwhile day, visiting one of the most iconic research sites in Britain.
