The talk takes us on a journey over the past 200 years or so when the area along on the banks of the River Welland, which form the border between Northamptonshire and Rutland, was transformed into a noisy thriving industrial landscape for about 4 years whilst the viaduct towering some 70 feet over the village of Harringworth was being built.

Our Speaker, John Hillier has authored several books and has recently been involved with filming by the viaduct, this time taking part in a film for the National Railway Museum about the "Flying Scotsman", an engine that has travelled across the viaduct several times.


The talk will include images taken from many vantage points around the area plus some taken from the air and also from the footplate of "Bahamas" when it crossed the viaduct in October 2021.

Monthly Meeting


As well as hearing from our interesting speakers, the monthly meeting is an opportunity to meet the committee and other members and in addition find out about social activities and new groups.

You are also be able to enjoy a free cup of tea or coffee on arrival.



Church Visits Group

The Church of St Mary Magdalene and St Andrew Ridlington: Grade II*

Thirteen members of the u3a Church Visits Group spent an afternoon at this lovely church and enjoyed an informative talk from Debra the church warden. The name of the church is unusual, and it is thought that 'Andrew' is a corruption of 'Andresgil' a minor saint whose day is the same as that of St Mary Magdalene, July 22.



The building is basically Anglo Saxon, early C13, the oldest parts are the pillars and arches on the south side of the nave and the chancel arch. In the chancel is a beautiful stain glass window of St Mary Magdalene and shows a star of redemption on her gown.

Over the north choir stalls is a fine memorial to Sir James and Lady Harrington.

There are four bells rung from the ground. The smallest is the original pre-Reformation Sanctus bell ornamented with a cross, a Tudor rose and sideways the letters 'SSS'. A glass fronted case holds some musical instruments, a bassoon, four oboes, a flute and a violin, and these were played from the gallery to accompany services, the gallery is now filled in. The family of John Thomas Scott had played the instruments and when he moved to Oakham in 1923 he donated them to

Major Victorian restorations were made in 1860. Debra asked all of us to sign the Visitors' book as this can help the church when applying for funding. After the talk we enjoyed a cup of tea and cake. To show our appreciation the group made a donation to the church.


