## Please keep your dog on a lead

There's nothing I like more than on a lovely, sunny spring morning than walking in the countryside and enjoying the spectacle of the emergent new life. Whether that be frogspawn, bluebells or hearing the birds beautiful song as they claim their territory in pursuit of finding a mate. Nature is under threat and so many of our bird species are declining at an alarming rate. This is



where, if you are a dog owner, you can help to make a difference by keeping your dog on a lead, especially between March and July, even later for some species. This is especially important when walking through a nature reserve. Please use a short lead, not one of those variable length trip hazards! Why? Because when dogs are allowed to roam far and wide, particularly out of your sight, they can frighten nesting birds, especially ground nesters like Curlew and Lapwing. The nest is then left open for predation whether it's the theft of the

eggs or chicks or just desertion of the nest by the parents. A few breeds may lay another clutch but for many that will be their chance to breed gone for that year. Additionally, don't forget a dog's natural instinct is to chase sheep and often cause them harm by doing so.

So be a good patron of the countryside and keep your dog on a lead – it will make a difference! Thank you, Janet Fernley. More information from:-

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### Summary of Chairman's report for AGM 2023

The Chairman began by introducing each member of the committee and thanking the outgoing members for their time on the committee. Those stepping down this year are Brian Fernley; Speaker Finder, Marilyn Burton; Groups Coordinator and Chris Ward; Membership Secretary, then introduced Neil Morley; Membership Secretary and Ed Dolphin; Groups Coordinator.

Some of the events that have occurred over the past year have been, A 'Thank you' luncheon for the Group leaders, Toby Buckland's Garden Festival. June saw the country celebrating the Queen's Platinum Jubilee and Sidmouth u3a joined in those celebrations by buying two tables in town to allowing up to 12 members to attend.

2022 was the 40th anniversary of u3a in the UK. Sidmouth u3a celebrated by holding an Open Day in September inviting the community in to see what we did. This was phenomenally successful with 162 people attending. 86 members and 76 non-members. Of those, 51 joined.

Two new members meetings were held during the year, and over the winter we held some extra Zoom meetings, but as attendance was low, we won't continue this.

In December we invited Simon Rees to return to entertain us, and at the end of January the Chairman attended a zoom meeting with East Devon Link.

Over the year various events and outings have been arranged such as a visit to SS Great Britain, skittles at The Blue Ball, two inter u3a quizzes in Willand and Honiton, a trip to The Great Hall in Exeter to see the Bournemouth Symphony Orchestra perform Violin Magic, and in March, Sing and Have Fun.

Every member of Sidmouth u3a pays £12 per year from 1st Feb - 31st Jan. Of that £12, £3.50 is paid to the Third Age Trust to cover the running of the organisation and insurance etc. The remaining £8.50 covers everything else including about 10 newsletters a year the vast majority of the newsletters are sent out by email therefore costing nothing, with a small number being printed because some members don't have an email account.

However, the cost of printing and posting a colour newsletter over the year works out at about 3 times the amount paid in by each member. Up to now the extra cost has been covered from general funds but this can't continue indefinitely so we have made a few changes. This month, and last, the newsletter has been printed in black and white, therefore significantly reducing the cost of printing. Newsletters will be made available at the monthly meetings for collection and only posted where a member cannot get here to collect or cannot get a friend to collect on their behalf.

Although we will continue to support those u3a members without a digital device, free of charge for a while, we will be making a change to the membership fee from 1st Feb 2024. The fee will remain at £12 to include an emailed copy of the newsletter, with a supplement for a printed copy, and we encourage all members who have an email address but refuse to submit it, to change to emailed newsletters, to help reduce costs.

As it is quite difficult to read the newsletter on a small device such as a phone we will have a small number of copies each month for the cost of £1 cash, available at the open meetings.

If a u3a member books a holiday with Riviera Travel and names their local u3a, we get a percentage of the cost of the holiday. This year Sidmouth u3a received £155 from just one holiday booked.

Lastly, and very importantly, your committee does a fantastic job but no-one stays forever, so we constantly need new people coming forward to help. We currently need;- **A Front of House Manager, a Speaker Finder and a Vice-chair.**
