What's Going On?

"2The Boys" by John Lowe

On the late evening of Friday, 21st March, 1941 an RAF Hampden bomber crashes on Dartmoor, the spot is marked with a memorial stone for future generations to observe. Our speaker found the stone whilst he was out walking and decided to discover more about these young who had died for their country.

John tells the story of each member of the crew of this aircraft, who, like all other RAF aircrew, were not conscripts but volunteers. They came from widely differing backgrounds and from all parts of the Commonwealth and beyond.



This presentation captures the mood of 1941 and relates the story that lies behind the stark granite memorial that now honours the final resting place of the Royal Air Force Hampden aircraft that crashed on the moor.

Groups Galore

Sidmouth U3A Geology group managed to keep going throughout the pandemic – by organising Zoom sessions twice a month. This year we also arranged two field trips for members – the first for three years!

In May, the first field trip was to the coast near Dawlish. In the morning, we visited Langstone rock – the remains of a spur of Permian sandstone and breccia, sliced through by Brunel for his railway. The rock contains deposits left by flash floods coming off the Variscan mountain range – located in what is now the English Channel and northern France – some 280 million years ago. It also displays caves and a rock arch – testament to the sea's erosive power.





Then walking

along the railway line towards Dawlish, we could see the splendid exposures of fossilised sand dunes – from when this area was a desert and located just north of the equator.

After lunch we explored the much more recent sandy spur of Dawlish Warren, formed after the last ice age, with material both moved eastwards by waves along the shoreline, and brought down by the River Exe.

In June, the second trip was to the Meldon area on the north west corner of Dartmoor – where massive geological forces of mountain building and volcanism in the Carboniferous period (over 300 million years ago), have left a legacy of folded and metamorphosed rocks, and veins of rare and valuable minerals. Highlights included the view from Meldon viaduct, exploring a former limestone quarry at Meldon Pool, and the visit to the small quarries where a vein of the



rare and useful mineral *Aplite* had been forced between the rocks, consequent on the superheated igneous intrusion of what is now the granite of Dartmoor.
