Volunteers needed!

All u3as are run for the members and by the members. A successful u3a needs about 10 to 15% of the members engaged in running the organisation. The backbone of volunteers is of course our group leaders. We are fortunate in having over 50 of them but with the influx of new members we could easily fill a few more groups. If you have an interest or pastime it is fairly easy to start a new group. You do not need to be an expert as there are plenty of resources and help available both locally and nationally. Or perhaps you are in a group with a waiting list, then you could start a similar group on a different day or week to suit you. If any of these ideas appeal then talk to either of our group coordinators for some advice. The other area are those who quietly support by assisting in preparing the hall and refreshments for monthly meetings and social events. They are always happy to have additional people to join the team. We still need people to '**Meet and Greet'**. Just ask at the next meeting

Finally we need new committee members. Each year a third of the committee resigns so we need another 4 to 5 people to step forward. This represents less than 1% of our membership so can you be that 1 in 100 we need? Bringing new faces and ideas helps us develop and change to meet the requirements of the members. It is not an onerous commitment nor are there lots of committee meetings. There are some tasks that need a little training but most of you would find it easy. It is imperative we have a full committee to keep the workload down to a minimum and also to meet our statutory requirements necessary because we are a 'charity'. Currently we need '*Front of House*' plus an additional '*Groups Coordinator*' and a '*Speaker Finder*'. If you think you could help please talk to any committee member to find out more.
