Using a genealogist's toolbox, Helen reveals the stories behind postcards sent more than a hundred years ago. Families who emigrated across the Atlantic to America and Canada, those who returned, and those who found tragedy aboard RMS Empress of Ireland in an event that could only be eclipsed by that of Titanic's, are remembered through postcards.

The safe arrival of a precious grandchild, a train delayed by the first national rail strike, bad weather, good luck – messages that go beyond 'wish you were here?' and open the door to the past. Weavers, button makers, butlers, motor bus drivers, a fitter of sanitary appliances and even the owner of a steamship – industrious employment from mills to the sea and all revealed in "Posted in the Past".

This is a return visit for Alex who spoke to us sometime ago about producing "Blue Peter" for the BBC. In this talk Alex gives us a brief description of how one BBC programme was organised and how key elements in the content came about. In this serendipitous process fire-fighting next to a collapsing building gave a lesson on the necessity for proper research, and deep in the African bush a missed opportunity with an isolated community, many of whom had never seen a white person, were among the lessons learned. To complete the spectrum, we recall near death experiences with presenters, such as with Matt Baker who was learning to fly a hang glider, and Helen Skelton who was tickled by a beard of bees.

The u3a is celebrating its 40th birthday by having a series of events around the country during September. The main ones being from the 17th to 25th September.

We will be joining in by having our monthly meeting on the 13th as an event open to both members and non members. Is the U3A 40 years old?

It was 1982 that the first u3a was founded in the UK. However for our new members, a bit of history. Ten years previous at the Toulouse University in France they started "Universite' du Troisieme Age' " where the professors led groups for local retired people. This spread across France to other Universities. This formula was then adopted in several other European countries. In 1981 a university academic in Cambridge, Peter Laslett organised a conference to discuss the possibility of bringing the 'University of the Third Age' to Britain. Their decision was that the UK version would be different, acknowledging that retired people have a lifetime of experience, skills and knowledge. Therefore there would be no formal teachers but Group leaders would be there to facilitate the teaching and learning process. Each u3a would be different depending on the interests and abilities of the members. Each u3a would be an autonomous entity, self financing and self managing. Importantly it was to be run by the members for its members. This formula has worked, as of today there are over 1000 groups with more than 430,000 members.

But how is the U3A doing in France? In 1990 the name changed to 'UTA – université tous âges' (University for all ages) or *Université du Temps Libre* but maintaining the academic connections. So currently there is no separate organisation for older people in France.

However if you drive south and west from Toulouse within a couple of hours you come to a region of France called 'Pyrenees Orientales'. There you will find a typical British u3a run by expats but with other



nationalities involved. Anyone from Sidmouth would feel at home there but with the weather warmer and the wine cheaper! To be continued.......
