On The History and Work of the Thames River Police

Originating as a partnership between the Government of the day and the West Indian planters and merchants, the Marine Police were formed to protect the vital trade between the West Indies and London from widespread theft on the Thames. Over the last two centuries the Thames River Police, as they have come to be known, have continued to protect the river, patrolling, with very few exceptions, 24 hours a day, seven days a week since their foundation.

Today the Thames River police still protects the river, as they have done since 1798. They are now recognised by UNESCO as the longest continuously serving police force in the world and, as forerunners of the Metropolitan Police, are the founders of modern policing.


A note from Brian Fernley

Sidmouth u3a Annual General Meeting held on 8th March 2022

Chairman's Report

Our previous AGM was held in May last year rather than March, so I'm reporting on the last 10 months rather than a full year. In March last year we were still in lockdown so it was decided that the AGM would be postponed until May in the hope that we could hold a face to face meeting rather than a virtual one. Unfortunately, in May, we were still unable to hold a meeting in the venue and the AGM was successfully held on Zoom with over 80 members present. I'm delighted to be able to present this report to you this year in person.

The past 10 months have still been a challenging time for us. The difference now is that the vast majority of members have had their vaccinations and boosters, which has allowed us to meet in venues with some confidence, although I understand that some members still prefer to stay at home. We continue to provide hand gel on entry, face masks for those who choose to wear them and windows open to increase ventilation

After last year's AGM our committee consisted of 9 members whose names can be seen on screen now. I continued to cover the role of Groups Coordinator until July when we had the pleasure of welcoming Marilyn Burton onto the committee. Marilyn worked tirelessly to look after all the groups until being joined in the autumn by Mary Holliday. Our groups have continued to grow in number and we now have 67 active groups. My thanks go to all of our group leaders and our two groups coordinators for their continued time and energy in making Sidmouth u3a the success it is.

In order to support our groups getting back to face to face meetings after what was for some, a long gap, we introduced the Welcome Back Bonus where group leaders could claim up to £50 to provide extra equipment, books, speaker, visits etc. I'm delighted to report this was a great success for the groups that took advantage of it with the money being spent on the following. Card table, first aid kit, books, speakers, lunch, afternoon teas.

A new members meeting was held on 29th July 2021 to welcome any new members joining since our previous meeting which was pre-Covid. This successful afternoon was organised by Chis Ward our Membership Secretary where we had 70 attend. Well done Chris. During this meeting we had 81 new sign ups for groups, keeping Marilyn very busy indeed. Chris has increased our membership number to 512 by the end of Feb.

We have another new members meeting planned for later this month. The groups display in August was successfully organised by Marilyn where we had 113 new sign ups for groups, plus 2 new groups.

In August of last year I attended the National AGM on behalf of Sidmouth u3a in Kennelworth, Warwickshire. During the AGM the retiring Chairman took time to thank all u3as that had remained active in some way during lockdown. Sidmouth of course was one of these.

By September our Social Committee was meeting again under the leadership of Andrea Talbot. Many events have been held since then. Some of which you can see on screen. Thanks to Andrea and the team for their work.

Our first annual lunch for years is booked for April of this year and I hope many of you can join us.

As you know Covid guidelines have changed numerous times over the last year but Keith, Front of House Manager kept us up to date to make sure we were operating under correct recommendations.

Keith stood down as Front of House at the end of October after some years in the role. During his time he wrote all of our detailed Health and Safety guidelines, which can be found on the website.

The role was temporarily covered by Jack Richmond until 10th Dec. We now welcome Jo Fox as our new Front of House Manager. Jo joined the committee in January. Thanks go to Keith, Jack and Jo.

All u3a groups, whatever they are and wherever they meet, must be financially self-supporting. All costs must be borne by the members of the group. However, due to a legacy bequeathed to us some years ago, we have been supporting the room hire for groups that are too large to meet in the home of the group leader. To start with, the support was up to 50% of the cost of the venue but was later increased to £18 per month. Book hire for the book groups was also included. That legacy money has now been used up but the committee decided to continue support from the savings account for a little longer. We have been able to do this because of the reduced expenditure during Covid.

This support will continue until the start of the autumn 2022. So from the beginning of September all groups must, once again, cover their own costs entirely. For any group leaders wanting to look for cheaper venues, a list can be obtained from your Groups Co-ordinators.

During the course of the year we have had many interesting talks at our open meetings. During the winter months we also held three meetings on Zoom for those members not wishing to attend large groups. These were very popular and we will consider this again for next winter if there is enough interest. Many thanks to Brian Fernley for his continued hard work as our Speaker Finder.

In the Autumn of last year Diana Crowther stood down as Treasurer and the role was taken up by Vera Arnold who joined the committee in October. Vera is assisted in the role by her husband Jim Wright. Thanks to Diana, Vera and Jim. Vera has worked hard to get the accounts in good shape for the end of the financial year and I must thank David Brittain, without his help we would still be working on them now. The accounts I will be presenting this afternoon are provisional and still need to be checked by a member of the organisation before being signed off as correct.

As you know, u3a is an organisation run for the members by the members and every single job that is carried out is done so voluntarily by members. We rely on the willingness of members to take on the various roles that are needed to keep Sidmouth u3a running and I am very grateful to everyone who takes an active part. This month Brenda stands down as Editor and her role will be filled by Brian Webb who will produce the next newsletter. Brian lives in Sussex, but hasn't let the distance between his home and Sidmouth prevent him from stepping forward to take on this role. Many thanks go to Brenda for the excellent quality of the newsletter over the past year. Brian will be welcomed onto the committee when we get to elect the new committee members.

In December we had our first Christmas Party. This is the first time we have planned something like this where we had a singer instead of a talk. Simon Rees was invited to entertain us and what a brilliant job he did. The whole afternoon went extremely well and I think everyone left with a smile on their face. We had many positive comments after the event, so if you would like a similar thing this year, do let us know.

I am looking forward to another year of leading Sidmouth u3a into whatever life holds for us and I thank everyone who takes an active role in helping me to do this, whether that be on the committee, making the tea and coffee, putting out the chairs, signing people in, making new members feel welcome, being a Group Leader or working on the Social Committee, and to everyone who attends our groups and open meetings THANK YOU.
