Nature Walks Group outing

60 mph winds and torrential rain was forecast for September's Nature Walks event with *April Windle*, a professional, self employed lichenologist (lichen expert). We didn't cancel it but we did move the



venue indoors as *April* was concerned that not only would it be unpleasant, it would be dangerous amongst the trees. "Indoors" was the beautiful old church at Salcombe Regis. April and I thought if the weather managed to clear up for a bit we could go out and see what lichens grew in the churchyard, which is just what happened.

April started off describing what a lichen was, which is a fungus which is joined by an algae, and saying how much she loved lichens and hoped after her talk that some of her enthusiasm for them would rub off on us. We were given a couple of twigs each with lichens on and with the use of a

magnifying lens we were told to look for 'wine gums' and 'jam tarts' which we could see quite clearly and with a bit of imagination they did look like wine gums and jam tarts.

And yes the weather did clear up for a bit and we were able to go into the church yard where we were able to look at lichens growing on the memorial stones. Lots of them. Some on limestone, some on granite, some on wood and by standing back you could see which species of lichen favoured which stone. Lichen species are very particular to keep to their own favoured habitat. We also saw some lovely ones on an old cherry tree and *April* was particular to point out that lichens growing on trees were beneficial for the tree's growth and not the other way round as some people believe.



We came away having enjoyed a really interesting morning with an excellent "expert".

Tech Corner with Tony Warren

PASSWORDS! This answers a question that arose from my first column in September.

We're all so fed up with having to have oodles of passwords for all kinds of things – most internet browsers offer to store your password so that they can automatically enter them for you next time you call up the website. So why don't I like using them? A few



reasons. Anyone who has access to my device has access to those passwords, no further security question or step is needed. Browsers are renowned for occasionally developing vulnerabilities. Would you want a suspect browser storing all your secrets? It isn't simple to access and manage passwords in your browser, they are really designed to enter them into websites when you need them, not give you a general management facility. Each browser, for example, Chrome, Safari, Edge, has to store your passwords – they don't share them unless you manually keep them the same in every browser. Browser password managers are only for passwords and payment cards, not for any other private data you need stored. It's all downsides as far as I'm concerned. Now, password safes (for example, ZoHo, Dashlane, Keeper, Nordpass, LegMeOnce) fill all the gaps and are much safer options. PC Magazine Review rates Dashlane and Zoho as the top two, ZoHo is free for individuals.

Advantages of a Password Safe

You have an account with the password safe supplier, it's a username (usually your email address) and password. All your password information is encrypted, by you, on your device, and sent to the supplier's secure servers as a meaningless string of data, they would never be able to work out what it means. That's not the end of it though because, when you need to access your data, you not only need your email address and password, but you also need a strong encryption key, usually called the "master password". It is that key which your device uses to encrypt the data, and then to decrypt it when it's needed, so nobody can do that except you. With password safes, you can even store other data that you want to keep private. Just like browsers, when you access a secure website, the password safe decrypts your password and puts it in for you, to save you typing it out. For me it's useful because I use a laptop, an iPad and an iPhone. They ALL have encrypted access to my passwords, no matter which browser I am using, and these are served up automatically to any website or application I want to log into. Finally, due to the simple, but very secure master password and decryption system, you aren't exposed to web browser vulnerabilities. So, my advice is to buy a password safe, or download a free one. There are loads out there, and turn OFF the browser permissions you allow for storing passwords. Tony

Last Word.... Don't forget that whatever internet browser you are using, you must see "https://...." starting the web address at the top. If that "s" isn't there, it is not safe. Exit immediately. And remember – don't believe ANYTHING on-line until you have carefully checked it's genuine.
