## Tawd Valley Walk successfully started

Due to be led by Neill, our walk along the Tawd valley on Thursday, 10<sup>th</sup> August, was in jeopardy of being cancelled. Neill had gone down with a chest infection and was unable to attend. David, just back from holiday, suffering from a sudden summer cold valiantly stepped in.

Consequently, he went to the library and met Dave Gibson, and introduced him to our nine members who had turned up. A very good turnout for the holiday season.

Dave, a committee member of Friends of Tawd Valley, and wild life photographer had volunteered and prepared a most interesting talk as we walked.



Starting from the back of the library we headed off towards Devil's Steps.

Along the route Dave told us, with the aid of maps and pictures, the history of the Tawd.

We found the site of the Old Corn Mill which was originally operated by a sluice from the river. An 1839 Tithe map showed that the owner was James Lyons and the occupier, the miller, was James Ambrose. Throughout the walk we were shown the best places to observe different species of wild life.



We went as far as the bridge, where the weir used to be and met an artist painting pictures on the bridge.



We never did reach Devil's Steps but if you go to the Mario Map link on LCC red rose collections 'River Tawd' there is much more information regarding the forgotten sites, photos and history of the river. Dave is a truly fascinating guide and we have provisionally booked him for next May to do a Wild Life topic.

We finished our walk, enjoyed by all, at the 'Miner's Peg' for a good meal and a natter.
