We meet in the Edgar Hall in Somerton on the first Friday of the month with a couple of exceptions, when we meet on the second Friday of the month, between 10.00am and 12.00 noon. Although we have a large membership we love to see and welcome any visitors to our talks.

In June the meeting is on Friday10th June when we will welcome Stephen Robson who will present a talk entitled "Neville Shute".

Nevil Shute Norway (1899 – 1960) was an English novelist and aeronautical engineer who spent his later years in Australia. He used his full name in his engineering career and **Nevil Shute** as his pen name, in order to protect his engineering career from inferences by his employers (Vickers) or from fellow engineers that he was "not a serious person" or from potentially adverse publicity in connection with his novels, which included On the Beach and A Town Like Alice.

He originally worked for de-Havilland Aircraft Company but moved to work for Vickers Ltd as there was more scope for advancement. At Vickers he worked as the Chief Stress Engineer on the R100 airship, and was then promoted to deputy Chief Engineer of the R100 project, under the leadership of Barnes Wallis. When Barnes Wallis left the project Shute became Chief Engineer.

With the fateful demise of the R101 airship, which was government designed, the R100 airship which had made a successful visit to Canada was grounded and subsequently scrapped.

He then teamed up with another de-Havilland trained engineer to form the aircraft construction company Airspeed Ltd. Airspeed grew over the years and produced many successful aircraft including the Airspeed Oxford with over 8,500 being built.



For the innovation of developing a hydraulic retractable undercarriage for the Airspeed Courier, and his work on R100, Shute was made a Fellow of the Royal Aeronautical Society.



On behalf of Dorset and Somerset Air Ambulance, I would like to thank you and members of Somerton U3A for your very generous and kind donation of £139.72 following your recent Talk. This includes £56.50 raised from the sale of our merchandise.
