Widely Available - 100 years later

- Dates taken
- 1841 - Sunday, 6 June
- 1851 - Sunday, 30 March
- 1861 - Sunday, 7 April
- 1871 - Sunday, 2 April
- 1881 - Sunday, 3 April
- 1901 - Sunday, 31 March
- 1911 - Sunday, 2 April
- 1921 - Sunday, 19 June (1921 was meant to be done in April like previous years but industrial upheaval delayed it)

1841 and before

- The 1841 census rounds up ages down to the nearest 5 years for anyone over 15.
- There are some census prior to 1841 but not many of them contain names as they were mainly taken for population numbers, but what is available is summarised at

- Note this only says what is available and where it is, if known, it does not have any details, you would have to go searching for those.

1931 and 1941??

- The 1931 census was carried out on the 12th April but it was destroyed by fire in 1942, 1941 was never done because of the war, the next census to be released will be 1951 after 2051.

1939 Register

- There is the 1939 register which is available and that is available as it is not a census and therefore comes under a 75 year rule rather than the 100 year census rule.
- It was taken on 29th September 1939, about a month after the outbreak of world war 2 and it was taken to record all people in the UK at the time in order to issue identity cards, ration cards and more.
- The register was updated (married names) until 1952 when the requirement for registration ceased, but the NHS continued to use the register and update it until 1991.
- Does not show place of birth but does have birthday

Other sources

- There are other records that have been collected from time to time and the availability varies, for example
 - Window Tax records,
 - Constables Census,
 - Hearth Tax records,
- in general these records will show the more affluent members of society and will rarely show females or children or the ages of people.
