|  | As at $31^{\text {st }}$ May 2022 the main account stands at $£ 8688.37$, the social account at $£ 386.90$ and we have $£ 25.00$ cash. <br> The membership fees (Capitation) that we pay Third Age Trust are now $£ 4.00$ per member but it was decided not to put up the membership fees and they were kept at $£ 10.00$ for the year 2021-2022. For this year 2022-2023 we have put them back up to $£ 16.00$ ( $£ 13.00$ if paid in June and July) as we are now having our monthly meetings at Surfleet Hall again. <br> You will see there are two payments for Capitation, the payments made to Third Age Trust, as the invoice we should have received in the previous year did not come in till this year. <br> We bought some new capital items, the two main ones being a new projector and screen. <br> We also had the June hog roast for the members which was money well spent as it was a great success and enjoyed by all who attended. <br> Due to the social account not being in use for a few months you will see money for social events going in and out of the main accounts but whatever came in is what we spent on that event so the money in the social account stays the same as at the end of last year. <br> We now are able to pay money out of the bank by online transfers which is making life much simpler both for us and our creditors and our members. I look forward to being the Treasurer for you for another year. |
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| 6 | Group Coordinators report <br> Firstly, I must start by thanking David Brennan, my predecessor who provided such a smooth transition and handover for me. <br> Secondly an enormous thank you to all the group leaders who have provided such a wonderful supportive service throughout Covid and beyond.
