- World of Books [www.wob.com](http://www.wob.com) has been recommended by some of our members as a good website for second hand books. It has free UK delivery and usually delivers within a few days. Another suggested website is [www.abebooks.co.uk/](http://www.abebooks.co.uk/) with most deliveries free.
