# Tuesday 24<sup>th</sup> January 2023 Guided Tour of Cambridge Central Mosque

Start Time 11:00 Europe's first Eco-friendly Mosque A unique prayer space that fuses traditional and modern architecture, and has green credentials that reflect Islam's ideals of earth, soul and community care, officially opened to the public on 24 April 2019. The Cambridge Central

Mosque design was inspired both by Islamic and English religious architectural traditions. The defining feature of Cambridge Mosque is its timber structure. The columns, or 'trees' reach up to support the roof in an interlaced octagonal lattice vault structure evocative of English gothic fan vaulting, famously used at the nearby King's College Chapel. Worshippers and visitors enter via an Islamic Garden before passing through a covered portico and then an atrium.
