# Wednesday, 20 March 2024 'Derbyshire Double Bill'

Robert Adams created this show Palace of the 1760s, the house is framed by historic parkland and boasts opulent interiors intended to impress.

Food available on site, you can either go for coffee on arrival or an early lunch.

Free time to tour the house at your leisure. Afternoon visit to Calke Abbey.

With peeling paintwork and overgrown courtyards, Calke Abbey tells the story of the dramatic decline of a country house estate. The house and stables are little restored, with many abandoned areas vividly

portraying a period in the 20th century when numerous country houses did not survive to tell their story. We aim to leave Kedleston Hall for Calke Abbey at approximately 12.00.pm (It is a 40 minutes coach drive) On arrival at Calke you could choose to have a late lunch followed by a free flow House Tour or go straight onto the house. We understand that only small groups are allowed at a time due to the size of the rooms. We plan to leave around 4 pm/4.30 when House closes. A busy, but hopefully very interesting visit.
