Greetings from the garden.

I cannot believe we have passed the Spring Equinox, but here we are in the 4th month, with nights shorter than days and warmer weather. Spring had definitely sprung.



Everything is early because of the very mild spell in late winter and there is plenty to do. Winter flowering clematis are now putting on a growth spurt and any excess growth should be cut back. If you haven't done it already, cut back fuchsias to a manageable size. Wait until the middle of the month the prune your Hydrangeas, then cut them back to a healthy outward facing bud. When your daffodils have finished flowering, dig up and split any overcrowded clumps. If you have clumps with more leaves than flowers, that's a sure sign that they are overcrowded so if you split them this month you will have lots more flowers next year. Do not cut back the leaves until they have died back. I know they look a bit unsightly but the goodness needs to go back down into the bulbs. Make a note to plant some Alliums around

them so that you have some continuity. Grape hyacinth, tulips and camassia will also guarantee the continued interest and take attention away from dying daffodil leaves. If you have a shady garden, bluebells will do well but make sure you buy British bluebells. Another beautiful bulb for late spring in Fritillaria meleagris, Snakes head fritillary. It thrives in shady areas and like most bulbs will spread and naturalise the area.

Plant of the month. It has to be Pulmonaria. Mine have been flowering since February and still are. This is another shade tolerant plant providing interest all year round. It's common name is Lungwort and it was used to treat respiratory problems in the past. There are quite a few new cultivars, blue, white and pink, but in my opinion, the original is the best with the blues coming a hot second. I love it because the foliage, which stays for most of the year is heavily speckled with silver which can brighten up a shady corner. I also love the fact that it manages to flower very early in the year, and continues to flower into late spring, sometimes giving me another flowering in autumn, but the best thing is the colours. The flowers are pink and mauve and blue, all on one plant. How pretty is that!

A couple of weeks ago, I bought some Nerine bulbs. Nerines are a beautiful pink flower, similar to Agapanthus but they flower in late autumn when most other thing have stopped. I've had flowers into early November. They are well worth a try if you haven't grown them before. They are happy in the garden or in pots. My new ones are still in the bag as I took ill the day after I bought them, but that's ok, they can be planted any time during the next month or even later.

Continue to sow your seeds according to the instructions on the packet. Don't forget to keep the feeders full for the birds and fresh water daily for birds and bees. Bumble bees and honey bees will be out foraging when the temperature is 50F or higher so say hello if you see one.

Well that's all from me this month as I'm running a temperature and not really up to thinking.

Enjoy your garden however small. Pots are just small gardens after all.
