Governance

The vision of the Trust is to have a smaller elected Board to handle governance alongside an elected Council, with delegated powers, which will represent all the branches.

It is hoped that the new arrangements will provide a necessary forum where branch ideas, concerns and experiences can be used to shape decision making. Currently, this model is being tested via a "Pilot Council."

Eligibility for membership - Age

The Chair of the Third Age Trust has written to all branches explaining that legal advice has been sought regarding age limits for membership. Although the u3a's focus will remain on older people who have retired from full time work, it is advised that age is not a restriction. Therefore, as long as branch activities are generally educational, national and local "objects" do not limit who can participate.

Member access to the Trust Website

In response to member feedback, the Trust are redesigning the content that members access on their website. This will be launching soon.

Regional Trustee - Information
