

FRENCH FOR BEGINNERS

The group is suitable for either the complete beginner, or those who may remember a little bit of French, from their schooldays. We use the BBC Language course book, "Talk French 1, ISBN-10 1406679003", supplemented with additional materials.

PICKLEBALL

What is Pickleball? Pickleball is a fun sport that combines elements of badminton, tennis, and table tennis. Played both indoors or outdoors on a badminton-sized court with a slightly modified tennis net. Two or four players use solid paddles made of wood or composite materials to hit a perforated polymer ball, over a net. We meet weekly on Fridays from 12.30 – 1.30pm or 1.30 – 2.30pm

COURTS: 3 badminton courts with 16 places per time slot, 12 play, 4 sit out and rotate on after 7 points per game. If demand increases we can add an extra court and increase to 20 players per session.

CAR PARKING: At Tesco Extra, which has an entrance in Bell Street is the best place.

GOLF GROUP

KURLING

No, it is not a spelling mistake. Kurling is a game/sport that is growing in popularity. There is a national body and thoughts that it could become an Olympic event in the future as it can be played by people of all abilities.

Kurling is played indoors, though outdoors is a possibility, on a hard surface. The equipment consists of 8 'stones', a target mat or 'house' and extendable pusher sticks.



The stones are plastic discs the size of a tea plate and have three large ball bearings underneath to allow them to glide over the floor. They can be propelled using the built-in handle or by pushing them with the pushing sticks. The latter allow those with limited mobility to take part. To be honest we all suffer to some extent with this. A ramp can also be used to allow players in wheelchairs to launch the stones.



As in curling, the aim is to get your team's stone nearest the centre of the house. A team consists of 2 or 4 players and a game usually played over 10 ends. Jean Attwood is the Kurling Group leader and can be contacted via this link:
