Chiswick House is a Neo-Palladian style villa. It is an example of Neo-Palladian architecture in west London, and was designed and built by Richard Boyle, 3rd Earl of Burlington (1694–1753), completed in 1729. The house and garden occupy over 65 acres The garden was created mainly by the architect and landscape designer William Kent, and it is one of the earliest examples of the English landscape garden.

The Café was designed by award-winning architects Caruso St John; the contemporary space looks out on the magnificent gardens and the neo-Palladian villa.
