Since the COVID19 experiences, visits to manufacturing sites have been more difficult, but not impossible ,to organise.

Past experience has been to organise a visit with a couple of date options, ask group members who is available on what date, and select the date most people are available. Travel was arranged within the group, members offering car lifts and sorting out "petrol" money individually. If we can get to an industrial site, there are generally no entrance fees, but some places of a more general interest do charge an entrance fee. Whilst away on visits, there is generally time (and enthusiasm!) for a pub lunch. There would be no fixed fees for belonging to the group. This means that the cost implications should be modest.
