26th January 2024: We will be looking to show **'A Man Called Otto'** starring Tom Hanks, Mariana Trevino and Rachel Keller. This film tells the story of Otto Anderson (Tom Hanks) a grumpy widower who no longer sees purpose in his life following the loss of his wife. When a young family move in next door it results in an unlikely friendship that turns his life around. This movie is about love, life, loss and new hope.

23rd **February:** We will be looking to show 'Le Havre' starring Andre Wilms, Kati Outinen and Jean-Pierre Darroussin. This is a French Film with English subtitles. Marcel Marx, formerly both a bohemian and struggling author, has given up his literary ambitions and relocated to the post city of Le Havre. He leads a simple life based around his wife, Arletty, his favourite bar and his low income profession as a shoe shiner. As Arletty suddenly becomes seriously ill, Marcel's path crosses with that of an underage illegal immigrant from Africa. Marcel and friendly neighbours and other townspeople help to hide him from the police. The police inspector may, or may not, be hot on their heels.

22nd March: This will be a week earlier than the last Friday in the month due to Easter: We will be looking to show 'The Shawshank Redemption' starring Tim Robbins and Morgan Freeman. It is 1947 and the film tells the story of Andy Dufresne (Tim Robbins), a successful banker in Maine who is convicted for the murders of his wife and her lover, a golf pro. Since the state of Maine has no death penalty, he is sentenced to two consecutive life sentences and sent to the notoriously harsh Shawshank Prison. This film, however, runs for 2 hours and 22 minutes.

Speaker's report for November



ShantyFolk

ShantyFolk are a landlocked shanty group from the Lavenham area. They have been singing together since 2014.

They entertained us with some lively renditions of sea shanties.

Two shanties were about Nelson. It was tradition for sailors to be buried at sea in their hammock. But when Nelson died, he was too important for this and needed to be buried back in England. How to keep his body "fresh" was a dilemma. He was encased in a barrel of rum and legend has it that holes were drilled into the sides and the liquid drained! Sailors essentially drank his blood during the long journey; therefore, it was called:



"Nelson's Blood". The other shanty was about Nelson's favourite ship: HMS Agamemnon. She was a 64-gun third-rate ship-of-the-line of the British Royal Navy.

Changing the atmosphere completely was a very moving modern shanty. "The Last Leviathan" was about the death of a species from the perspective of a whale.

Another memorable one was "Itches in the Britches" which tells the story of a man's vital parts from birth!

Shanty Folk to date have raised £10,000 for various good causes including the RNLI.

A lively and fitting end to the last u3a meeting of 2023.
