

Birdwatching Group Visit to SBBO Sandwich Bay 16th August 2023

On a warm and sunny day eight of us visited the Sandwich Bay Bird Observatory Trust (SBBOT) where we were met by John Buckingham, a lecturer on birds and highly qualified bird ringer. Now retired he is very involved with the Trust as a volunteer and continues to give talks, demonstrations, and training those who wish to develop the skills of bird ringing.

In 1952 local naturalists began ringing birds as the area is an important fly path for bird migration but ten years later it became the SBBOT. Over the years the centre has continued to develop and provides walks, talks / education and now provides overnight facilities. Whilst there are three nature reserves surrounding the area it remains separate as having a different function.

The area is ideal for netting large numbers of birds for ringing and monitoring, and gathering information which is recorded and sent to the British Ornithological Trust where a central register is kept. Included in the information is date and time seen, the weight, health, age, the species, and details if previously ringed regardless of where and the numbers seen. From this central register one can identify if birds are continuing successfully or numbers are declining and if so, they are then entered on a yellow or red list.





Our visit began in the birding room where we saw how the above information was obtained. The birds were brought in from the nets in individual bags which kept them calm and then held in a specific manner throughout the procedure. They appeared quite unperturbed by their experience.

The birds we saw being ringed-

Willow Warbler, Black Cap (Photos), Reed Warbler, Whitethroat and Cliff Chaff, amongst others





From the ringing room we went in to one of the 'education' rooms where John told us about the Trust, showed slides and related them to the talk which included migration and breeding patterns.

After lunch we walked to one of the scrapes, an area for watching waders where there was a choice of two hides. Time passed quickly and after a rewarding visit we left for home

Birds seen at Rest Harrow scrape -

Female Pheasant, Swallows, Little Grebes, Gadwalls, Tufted Ducks, Lapwings, Black Headed Gulls, Coots, Snipes, Green Sandpipers, Mallards,

Starlings, Heron, Moorhens, Shoveler, Teal, and a Hobby which obligingly appeared in pursuit of prey.









We also saw a number of different butterflies. All the surrounding area had been left wild so there was an abundance of plants and together with a lot of blackberries well on to the way to ripening.

Due to an outing in September taking place on the same date as the next birding visit would take place it has been cancelled. The details of the October meeting as below & in the following newsletter.

As always, anyone who would like to join the group will be most welcome. Knowledge is not essential as none of us are experts but enjoy the countryside.
