

Group News


Antiques and Collectables Group


We had no special topic for our first meeting of the year, but there was a coincidental theme around travel from some of the members. Judy showed us a beautiful book which was a copy of one first published in 1675 by John Ogilby. It is 'An Illustration of the Kingdom of England and the Dominium of Wales'. It was given to Judy's husband's uncle by Alexander Duckham, who had bought the original and made copies for his friends in 1939. It has beautiful drawings and diagrams of major roads and the areas around them.

John also had some old maps – he had been given a London map book by his brother. This was 'Philips ABC Pocket Guide to London', published in 1923. We









were interested to see local maps of places that had changed considerably over the years. This was a forerunner of the A-Z London street atlas which was compiled by Phyllis Pearsall & first published in 1936

Continuing the motoring theme, Audrey brought along an old RAC badge which would have been fixed to the front of a car belonging to an RAC member. From 1901, if someone had a problem with their vehicle, they could phone a patrolman who would arrive on a motorbike with a sidecar to give assistance. They wore a uniform, and if a car with a badge went past, the patrolman was expected to salute the driver. The organisation was called 'The Royal Automobile Club' because of King Edward V11's interest in motoring.

Two people had walking sticks - Dave purchased one in Chichester which had an animal's head. He was told that it had belonged to Richard Branson's mother. Dave later wrote a story inspired by the stick. We were not sure what animal it portrayed – possibly a giraffe. Dave didn't know what type of wood it was made from, but he had discovered that someone who collects walking sticks is called a Rabologist. Look out for that question to come up in one of his quizzes!

Anna also had a walking stick. Hers is wooden with a rounded head, and it was given to her by her father. He claimed it had been carved from the





wreckage of a war time Zeppelin. Anna has no evidence to back this up, but it is an intriguing claim.

Moving away from travel, I showed the group some women's magazines that I had picked up at Detling. 'Woman and Beauty' was published in 1954 and cost two shillings. It is filled with useful fashion and homemaking tips for women, and the adverts are fascinating too. Apparently, according to the Electricity Service Centre, the foundations of modern living are the electric cooker, water heater, washing machine and refrigerator, and low bills are a certainty. Times have changed!

Tony passed round several newspapers which were facsimile copies of war papers. They included the Evening News and the Daily Mirror. They have lots of interesting photographs and features from World War 2. Tony likes to collect these from antique fairs.

Lastly, Wendy brought along a medal which had belonged to Tony's mother. She was in a church choir in New Eltham in the 1960s. The Royal School of Church Music (RSCM) is a Christian music education organisation dedicated to the promotion of music in Christian worship. It began in Bullers Wood in 1929 but is now based in Salisbury. Choristers were given different medals to denote their grade and level of musical achievement.

Looking at Art Group

GUILDHALL ART GALLERY

Members of the Looking at Art group visited the Guildhall Art Gallery in the City of London. This little-known gallery is home to a huge collection of paintings owned by the City of London Corporation. The collection of over four thousand art treasures includes work by well-known artists and dates from 1670 to the present day. It is not possible to display all of the work in a small gallery. There is a particular strength in the Victorian material, including some Pre-Raphaelite pictures.

Our guide, Marion, took us around the building and explained the thematic approach to the displays. She paid particular attention to a number of paintings. These included:

"A Sonata of Beethoven (Alfred Emslie 1912) – a strangely haunting picture.

"Too Early" (James Tissot 1873) – a picture which seemed to provoke more questions than answers. Who was the woman in the pink dress?

"My First Sermon" and "My Second Sermon" – two paintings by John Millais which featured his young daughter.



"The Garden of Eden" (Hugh Riviere 1901) – a sad picture of love in the Victorian era.



We also looked at pictures by Marianne Stokes, William Logsdail, Grayson Perry, and a group of 20th century portraits by Sir Matthew Smith.







The gallery on the lower-level featured paintings showing aspects of London - all very different, but all very pleasing. We also had the opportunity to see a very early portfolio of the plays of William Shakespeare, published in 1623. Our final stop was to see the remains of the Roman Amphitheatre. This is nearly two thousand years old and was once the entertainment centre of Londinium. Having been lost for centuries, it was found by archaeologists in the 1980's.





It was a very enjoyable morning, and we were lucky to have such an excellent guide to enhance our time there. We ate lunch in a nearby (and quite historical!) pub before finding the train to take us home. I would recommend the Guildhall Art Gallery as a very worthwhile place to visit for anyone interested in art and London history.
