News from the Groups

Antiques and Collectables Group

This month's offerings did not disappoint.





Audrey recalled how a friend of her mother had a connection with J&J Cash Ltd of Coventry and passed on some interesting items to her. This company (familiar to many of us for their clothing name tapes) made the ribbons for the Victory medal following WW1. They sent swatches to Wardles's who were a silk dyer in Macclesfield. Audrey has a sample sheet of coloured silks plus some ribbons made up ready for the medals. She also has framed a number of silk cards and other items made by J & J Cash – some of these were given to her by another member of our group.



Penny brought along her 'Wobble Head' Kangaroo – this was made of wood by the Spanish firm Goula and dates from the 60's. Penny purchased it on one of our antique group days out. I have some similar Goula figures which I love. They all have a small spring attaching the head to the body to make them wobble.



Tim had several pieces of crested china, mostly souvenirs of different places - there was a small jug from Gravesend, and a commemorative item for William Rufus, who was shot by mistake in the New Forest. We also liked the model of the First World War memorial in Dartford which stands at the entrance to Central Park.

Tony showed us some more of his favourite rocks – a slice of agate which has been polished to show up the lovely colours, a piece of quartz which was pink because of the minerals in

the area, and another quartz which came from the Dorset coast. This was a large pebble that had broken open to reveal beautiful sparkling quartz inside, which had been created when water entered the hollow stone.



Tony had the oldest objects by far, as these were probably several thousand years old!

Jenny's lovely plate belonged to her grandmother, and was made by Wedgewood, in an Oriental style, dating from around 1812 – 1929. It is in good condition, despite having been hanging on the wall for some years.





My brass bell weights were recently bought in Otford - they are very tactile, ranging from 4lb to 2oz. They date from around 1880 and would have been used on balance scales in banks, grocers and butchers. They are filled with a lead plug and calibrated to the weight shown on the front. The oldest evidence of balance scales was found in Ancient Egypt on murals dating

from 2600BC, believed to be a system of measurement used to calculate gold yields.



Lastly, John displayed another old dinner plate, this time one of several we have that belonged to his grandmother who lived in Eltham. It was made by Keeling & Co based in Burslem, who operated between 1886 and 1936. The pattern is the Marlborough design and the marks on the bottom indicate a manufacturing date of 1908. His grandmother was in service until she married the gardener in 1915, and John thinks the plates may have been given to the couple by their employer antiques and Collectables Group

Art Appreciation Group

The group decided this month to share 'arty' Christmas cards we had received and find out a little about the artist behind the image. This is getting harder to do – we seem to receive fewer cards as we have got older, for various reasons – higher postage fees, more 'E' versions being used, more people giving to charities instead of sending cards, and so on.

However, we all produced something for the meeting!

Lynne had a card entitled 'Stride for Stride' of two racehorses jumping over a fence. This is

by the equestrian painter Jane Braithwaite, who lives in the Yorkshire Dales and has always had an affinity with horses. She was a teacher for 23 years, and then ran a country clothing business. She now spends her time painting cityscapes and portraits, and her main love — horses. She has won awards for her artwork inspired by racing, polo, and eventing.





Christina brought a picture by Rik Wouters, a Belgian artist. Wouters studied sculpture at art school and worked in his father's sculpture workshop. He later went to Paris and studied the Impressionists. He began painting and often used his wife Helene as a model. It is her in the portrait 'Reading Woman'. His work was vibrant and colourful, mainly of still life images and interiors. He was one of the Fauvist group of artists. Unfortunately, in WW1, Wouters was detained in a prisoner of war camp. He was sent home in 1915 due to ill health but died the following year of eye cancer, aged 34.

Tim received a card featuring 'The Procession of the Magi' by Benezzo Gozzoli. This image is from the Magi Chapel in Florence. Gozzoli covered the walls in frescoes for the Medici family, who effectively ruled Florence at that time – around 1459. The east wall features the procession led by Caspar on his white horse and is an interesting portrayal of pomp and secular elegance. Gozzoli included a number of members of the Medici family and other important dignitaries of the time.





Anna's card was of an image by Jessie Wilcox Smith, who was an American illustrator (1863-1935) who is best known for her illustrations of children's stories and nursery rhymes. One of her most famous projects was to illustrate a 1916 publication of 'The Water Babies' by Charles Kingsley.



Next, we looked at a card belonging to Margaret of a painting by Charles Altamont Doyle, father of Arthur Conan Doyle. It shows people skating on Duddingston Loch near Edinburgh. Charles was employed as a surveyor but to supplement his income he illustrated books and publications. His work was of fairies and fantasy scenes – these became rather macabre as he slipped into depression and alcoholism. He was eventually consigned to an asylum until he died.

I chose a rather lovely, sketched study of an angel, by Giovanni Francesco Barbieri, (1591 – 1666) who was known as Il Guercino – the Squinter, because he was cross-eyed. He was



self-taught but studied under various older artists. He worked on commissions such as the altars and ceilings in the Vatican for Pope Gregory XV. There are many impressive paintings by him, but I rather prefer the simple practice drawings using red 'sanguine' and white chalk plus ink.

John showed the group a collection of home-made cards depicting winter trees which he had received over several years. He claimed not to know who they were by....

Birdwatching GroupBirding visit 18/01/2023

This was the first visit of the year end we had chosen Danson Park as it offers the possibility

of seeing a variety of birds. The park is the largest in the Bexleyheath area covering seventy-eight acres pre-dating the 13th. century and home to several local events through the year.

Six of us met in the Stable car park on a very cold and frosty but sunny morning from where we did a circular walk through a small, wooded area and then on to an open grass area alongside a small stream before accessing a path which took us around the lake.

During our visit we saw the following birds. Blue Tits, Long Tailed Tits, Pied Wagtail, Magpies, Carrion Crows, Ring Necked Parakeets, Wood Pigeons, Feral Pigeons, Robins, Cormorant, Grey Heron, Black Backed Gull, Coots, Moorhens, Canada geese, Lesser Black Backed Gull, Egyptian Geese, Mute Swan Black Swan, Mallards, Herring Gull and Great Tits.

An enjoyable morning ending with lunch in The Stable for five.
