Allotment - Barnstaple District Council have offered us an allotment in **Mill Road, Barnstaple**, that's near Rolle Quay. The plot is sunny, sheltered and not overgrown. The idea is we will use this plot as a group. I think 1½ hours a week should keep the plot planted and tended. Entry is by code, this allows members to come and go as many times as they



want to, at a time when it's convenient for them. The group's members can grow the fruit, vegetables and flowers that they like. There is 1 hour free parking in Potterton Road, free parking before 10:00am and after 4:00pm and all day on Sunday in a car park close by. At this time there is no shed or water on the plot, however a U3A member has offered us a summer house free of charge. This will be our shed, giving us storage for gardening tools etc. We will ask Barnstaple District Council for their permission to place this on our allotment - so fingers crossed for that. We will collect the water from the roof and store it in a 1000 litre container. There will be a bench so we can sit down, take it easy and admire our allotment. The finer details will be discussed at our group's meeting, we will decide how the plot is divided, work and produce shared.
