was not for me. I fed the birds in winter and left the grass a bit long in May. Recent housing developments in the town at Three Fields and Appledore Green, along with the planned development of the Limes Land site off the Appledore Road, add up to a considerable loss of wildlife habitat. The swifts and swallows that were common in the town seem to have disappeared in recent summers. Bees, butterflies and pollinating insects are in decline, threatening our food crops.

There's more to rewilding than leaving the grass long in No-Mow May. It's also about small contributions through simple actions in our gardens and public spaces. Our study morning is an inspiring opportunity to discover what more can be done to support wildlife and the environment in Tenterden.
