## **VCV Hall Evacuation Procedure**

Fire Marshals will be introduced to the members at meetings.

Fire Marshals have armbands, and they will be worn at every meeting

In the event of an evacuation **SILENCE** should be maintained when exiting the building so that instructions can be clearly heard.

Help will be given to those who are less able to leave the building.

Please do not collect your personal items which should be left behind and a calm exit should be made.

The Time Traveller's Wife - Ron Fenn



This is a love story with a difference; a stage production that involves some impressive effects and a willing audience that soon goes with the flow of the story. A couple fall in love; Clare who becomes a talented sculptor and Henry who is fated to become a time traveller transported backwards and forwards to difference moments of Clare's life. In time she accepts that Henry can disappear suddenly at the wrong moment and reappear again. Despite this they stay in love, and it is a case of resilience against the time travelling of Henry which so often seems to be pulling them apart.

The lyrics illustrate the pressure they are under and their determination to overcome this. There is no control over Henry's disappearance, and he can be gone in a flash; one drawback is that time travelling means arrival is without any clothes and this leads to some interesting moments. The production benefited from a small and energetic cast who ensured that there was never a dull moment and kept the storyline moving forward as Henry came and went. The way in which he disappeared on stage was very impressive and the movement of the scenery matched the changing locations as he reappeared. It was a sad but also uplifting example of love conquering the odds. Another interesting and a very different VCV theatre trip.

## London Walk - Text, Photographs & Frost bite - Trevor Spinage


On a bitterly cold morning we met our guide John Colmans at Aldgate Station for a London walk entitled Aldgate and Spitalfields. John first pointed out the position of the old London wall. Just inside the wall was Holy Trinity Priory. Outside the wall, but part of the priory, was the church of Saint Botolph. The priory was dissolved by Henry VIII, but the church remains. Saint Botolph is the patron saint of travelling and it was the custom when emerging from Aldgate to visit the church to pray for a safe journey. The current church was built by George Dance the Elder in 1744.

John explained that the area known today as Spitalfields takes its name from an old hospital, known as St Mary Spital. The area is known for three groups of immigrants, The Huguenots, French Protestant silk weavers who were persecuted in Catholic France and arrived here in the 18th century; the Jews persecuted in Eastern Europe in the 19th century and in the 20th century, immigrants from Bangladesh. Sadly, the area is also known for the murders committed by Jack the Ripper. John pointed out some of the locations relating to the murders as we walked around but will be repeating his Jack the Ripper walk later in the year.

Our first stop on the walk was Middlesex Street, better known by its other name, Petticoat Lane. It was originally a second-hand clothes market which operated only on Sundays. Today there are many market stalls in the area selling mainly clothes. One budding entrepreneur who started as a stall holder here was Alan Sugar.



John then took us to Brune Street to see what used to be a Jewish soup kitchen. Opened here in 1902, it provided help for the poorer Jews of the area. Today only the facade of the original building remains.





Spitalfields. Brick Lane Mosque was originally a French Huguenot chapel. Later it was converted into a synagogue. Finally, with the arrival of the Bangladeshi immigrants, it became a mosque. Further up Brick Lane we could see a tall chimney, all that is now left of the old Trumans brewery which closed in 1989. Turing left into Hanbury Street we saw Hanbury Hall which was and still is used for meetings. In 1888 the match girls held strike meetings here.



Spitalfields Market was once a flower market but now houses various stalls including many fast-food outlets. Nearby in Elder Street, a blue plaque marks the former home and studio of the painter Mark Gertler, whose most famous work, Merry-Go-Round, is replicated on a metal roundel set into the pavement.

In Folgate Street is Dennis Severs' House. Severs not only lived in the house but 'shared' it with an imaginary family of Huguenot silk weavers. He arranged each room as it would have been in the 18th and 19th centuries as if the occupants had only just left it.

Our final stop on John's fascinating walk was Sandy's Row Synagogue. This synagogue was used by the poor, immigrant Jews of London's East End. Dating from the mid-19th century, it is the oldest surviving Ashkenazi synagogue in London and is the last remaining Jewish place of worship in Spitalfields.







#### WE DON'T MEAN TO WORRY YOU BUT .....

Here are some current scams to watch out for. Please help to raise awareness by alerting your friends and family.

**Mobile phone offers**: You receive a call from someone claiming to be from your mobile phone provider offering a big discount on a new phone. They then use your account details to purchase a new phone. The phone is delivered to you, but the fraudster then calls you to say the wrong phone was sent. They arrange to collect it, but they then keep it for themselves.

**Whats App messages**: You receive a Whats App message claiming to be from your son or daughter. They say their phone is damaged and they urgently need money transferred to a bank account to arrange a replacement. This is a scam.

**PayPal Request Money emails**: You receive an email which uses PayPal's Request Money feature. The wording is designed to look like a payment has already been made - this is to pressure you into clicking on the payment link. If you receive a Paypal email about a payment you were not expecting, treat it as suspicious and do not click on the "Pay Now" link in the email.

On average in Hertfordshire, between April and December 2023 **one person every day reported they had been hacked**, according to information from Action Fraud. While the hacks may not have directly led to money being lost, the hacks could be used to mount phishing scams or possible extortion attempts against the victim or their online contacts.

## Ways to protect yourself from hackers:

- Use strong passwords. Make your passwords as difficult to guess as possible.
- Use Two Factor Authentication (2FA). This provides an extra security check when logging into online accounts.
- Keep your software up to date. This can prevent hackers exploiting security issues found in some applications.
- Use a firewall or anti-virus software. Firewalls protect one computer network from another by only allowing certain communications. Most computers with Windows or Mac OS come with a software firewall installed. Make sure it is turned on.
- Avoid clicking links or opening attachments in unsolicited emails or on social media messages.
