HISTORY GROUP TRAIL AROUND HISTORICAL NOTTINGHAM

On Tuesday 15th March a group of 18 members and guests of our U3A met in Nottingham's Old Market Square. Fortunately, we were blessed with bright, sunny weather. A trail of Saxon and Norman towns of Nottingham had been prepared by Tamar, a bona fide Nottinghamian, who was our leader and tour guide for the day. We were provided with



booklets, giving us detailed information and photographs of all the main places of interest, including,



amongst others, the Council House, the original Boots store, Malin Hill, St Peter's and St Mary's Churches, Broadmarsh, the original Nottingham Theatre, Weekday Cross, Severn's House and a few ancient hostelries! Mel assisted us with the pronunciation of the alternative name to Snottingham given to the town by Bishop Asser

in the 10th century of Tig Guocobauc (close to the modern Welsh name of Gogofawg) meaning, 'Dwelling of Caves.' At each site of interest Tamar spoke to the group in addition to reading aloud from sections of the booklet. Lunch was taken at the historic Bell Inn just off the Market Square before resuming our tour for the afternoon, which thankfully

was mostly on a downward gradient! After a further hour and a half of sight-



seeing we concluded our trail at Patisserie Valerie in the Council House's Handley Arcade. A most interesting and socially enjoyable day for all, whether familiar or not with Nottingham. There was plenty to learn and ponder on!
