Notes from the Chairman

As you are aware from previous newsletters we are having difficulty with the timing of our monthly meetings. We have had to change our plans three times in the last 5 months.

This issue has been discussed with the management of the Ex-servicemens club and they are unable to commit to our regular use of the room at the club on the second Friday of the month. There was about 20% fewer members at Mays meeting when it was changed than the April meeting that did not have to be changed.

The committee have discussed the problem and decided we should look elsewhere for a venue that we can use on the <u>same day each month.</u>

We looked at other possible venues in Warsop and found the only one that suited our needs with suitable facilities is the Oaklands. There is plenty of parking and it is available for meetings in the morning.

There are 3 drawbacks that have cropped up.

- 1. The only morning that it is available in the month is the third Monday. Meaning we would have to change our day.
- 2. Public transport to the Oaklands is difficult. We have looked at this and are aiming to set up a buddy/car share system to help those members with transport difficulties. Please let us know if this applies to you.
- 3. It clashes with the Craft Group, apologies to the Craft Group.

The result of this deliberation is that from the 3rd Monday in July (July 18th) our meetings will take place at the Oaklands. 10.15am to 12.15pm. The 3rd Monday of the month is the <u>only</u> morning session available.

We are aware that this change may be difficult for some members and apologise if that is the case. But we feel that this is best way forward to maintain and grow Warsop & District u3a. We hope to use the time between now and the July meeting to sort out members problems as far as we possibly can.

The June meeting will take place as planned at the Ex-Servicemens club, on the 10th June.

We the committee are looking forward to being able to hold meetings as planned with confidence that the plans are not going to be altered.

Unfortunately Rosie Woollings has had to step down from the committee, due to health reasons. I would like to thank her for her work on the committee and wish her well for the future.

There are now the vice chair, speaker seeker and group co-ordinator roles on the committee vacant. This puts extra pressure on the members of the committee to cover these areas. If you are able to help on the committee (not necessarily in the named roles) please get in touch. You don't need to wait for the AGM to come around.

This brings me to the AGM, it is fast approaching, September 15th. Information on the current committee members and nomination forms can be found at the end of this newsletter.

The Jubilee afternoon tea was a success, there were 41 people present. Thank you to all who attended and to the helpers on the committee. There is a fuller report in the items of interest section.

Our visit began with a brief introduction to the history of Rufford. We followed the audio trail developed by Notts County Council which

visits 9 points around the building and describes the appearance and use of each area in Victorian and Edwardian times. Thanks go to one of our visitors, Andrew, who used google to answer a couple of questions we did not have answers to. He discovered the ice in the icehouse lasted all year and
