





## **History Group**



Remains of first mill

#### Warsop & District U3A History Trip to Arkwright's Mill

Eleven members of the history group participated in the trip to Arkwright's Mill at Cromford on Tuesday 20<sup>th</sup> September. We were met by our guide Cliff who gave us an interesting tour of the mill and told us the story of how Richard Arkwright, born into a poor Lancashire family, who started out as a wig maker went on to develop and patent a spinning machine capable of making strong cotton thread in large quantities. He built the first water powered cotton mill and industrial village in Cromford to house his large workforce in 1769.



The first mill was five storeys tall, It was powered by a huge water wheel with water from the sough of nearby lead mines. Soughs were deep underground pits which drained water from the mines to keep them from



flooding. Arkwright used the water from Bonsall Brook in nearby Scarthin too by diverting it underground by means of a culvert to his mill, His second mill was seven storeys tall with the wheel inside the

factory to increase the humidity in the building which aided the spinning process and increased production. Only the foundations and wheel pit survive today.

The bridge within the mill site was in existence long before the mill was built and a Roman road ran close by. The water from the mill drained into the nearby Cromford canal. The mills were enclosed by stone




walls and warehouses making the site secure. The warehouses lacked lower windows. This may have been a security feature as those who lost

their livelihoods dur to the mills threatened to burn Arkwright's mills or it could be to prevent spying on

Arkwright's machines to see how they were built and copy them without paying Arkwright for the patent.



In the afternoon some of the group visited Cromford village and walked around the history trail, viewing grade 2 listed buildings which were the homes of Arkwright's workers, the primary school built for children working at the mill and the Bear Pit and Greyhound Pond, visible parts of the engineering which diverted Bonsall Brook under the village to the mills and finally the village lock up which is now an art gallery.











Our next meeting is at 10am on Tuesday 18<sup>th</sup> October at St Theresa's church hall when Chris will be investigating Robin Hood, The Making of a Legend. Hope to see you there. Barbara, Sue & Tamar
