Free Transport to Kedleston Hall on offer

Are you an Individual Life Member of the National Trust? If the answer is Yes, please read on.

If you are, it is likely that your membership status allows you to admit a guest into a National Trust Property or Estate free-of-charge. This should be clear from your membership card &/or other membership details.

Fancy a "free transport" trip to Kedleston Hall, Derbyshire on **Tuesday 20th September**, then please "carry on reading"!

A number of members of the Orienteering Walking Group are National Trust members (myself included) & usually are supportive of their objectives and how they operate. However, it is felt by some, including myself, that charging non members £9 p.p. admittance to a National Trust Estate, just so folk can walk around their permanent orienteering courses, park a car & use the toilets, is "a bit steep", particularly as members & non members alike, will be additionally contributing to the National Trust by other means, including spending money in the cafe & shop.

Other than the costs of car travel, generally speaking the only other costs our group members are committed to (excluding optional cafe costs), when walking in estates run by local authorities & the forestry commission, are car parking costs - typically less than £5 shared by how many people there are in individual cars.

Whilst some of our non members are prepared to pay the £9 charge, others aren't.

I discovered however that there is a potential perfectly legally way to avoid this charge, by gaining admission for free if accompanying an Individual Life Member of the National Trust.

Thus if any of you out there are able to help out some of our group's members in this way (in return for free travel) & fancy a trip to Kedleston Hall, Derbyshire on Tuesday 20th September, I'd love to hear from you.

After leaving West Bridgford at 9am and subsequent arrival at Kedleston Hall, whilst our group are orienteering walking you'd have a number of options:-

- Tour the Hall
- Look round the grounds & estate
- Drinks lots of coffee & eats lots of cakes in the cafe &/or explore the gift shop
- Or even, trying out orienteering walking with the group we encourage novices with no prior experience

After our walk, which starts at 10.00 & usually lasts 2-3 hours, you'll be welcome to join our group members for lunch - which typically takes an hour.

After lunch, some of the orienteering group may wish to look round the Hall, which you could join in with also.

New Service For The Deaf Community

A ground-breaking new service enabling the deaf community to report emergencies, including crimes in progress, is now being provided by Nottinghamshire Police.

The free service connects users to British Sign Language interpreters remotely through a dedicated 999 BSL app on their phone, or via the 999 BSL website.

The interpreter, who will appear on the caller's screen, will then relay the conversation with the 999 call handler by seeing and communicating with the deaf person on the screen.

Police, fire, ambulance or coastguard services can all be accessed via the new 999 BSL system which is now available in the United Kingdom 24 hours a day, seven days a week, 365 days a year.

The service is available as both a smartphone app (iOS and Android) and a webbased platform.

The service gives the public a new way to report crimes, incidents and gain advice and gives people the opportunity to get support without needing to phone.

OUR 'STAR' BIRDS

The Birdwatching group has been busy getting out and about with two enjoyable day trips, Cannock Chase and Blacktoft Sands and unusually a night visit to Budby Common in Sherwood Forest.

Cannock Chase provided us with an enticing landscape of undulating heathland and woodland. Cuckoos sang all around us throughout the day which was a treat even though we never had a good view of one. Sadly its a sound we hardly ever hear these days. However, we had a wonderful spectacle of a redstart, who despite a noisy and boisterous crowd of schoolchildren, resolutely remained perched in front of us allowing even some of the children to closely observe him in the scope. We located a great spotted woodpecker nest and could hear the young inside the tree trunk calling for food. Meadow pipits abound and their less common cousins, the tree pipits showed well. Unfortunately the rain came and cut short our visit but not before we were entertained by the unusual appearance of two hobbies being mobbed by swifts.

Blacktoft Sands sited on the south bank of the River Ouse where it widens to become the Humber Estuary is definitely the place to see marsh harriers. We had at least four in sight at one time gliding over the reed beds hunting for food for their young. Some members were lucky enough to spot the sudden and brief appearance of a bittern and a water rail. Several elegant avocets waded in the pools and a sleepy spoonbill eventually woke up to show us his unique beak. Despite scanning many large heaps of horse manure left by the Konik ponies, who graze on parts of the reserve, and a favourite foraging place for yellow wagtails, only a few of us saw a yellow wagtail and it wasn't on the dung after all! In the distance from its luxurious tiled abode, a barn owl appeared in the doorway with a glimpse of its young in the background.

The main purpose of our evening visit to Budby Common was in the hope of spotting the elusive nightjar. As they only become active after dusk, we hung around until late but our vigilance wasn't to be rewarded as we only heard their distinctive churring in the distance. We did however watch several woodcock take flight and heard a cuckoo. Nice to know they are still on our patch! **Linda**

Beta-Alanine Supplementation in Adults with Prediabetes

Do you have prediabetes?

(blood sugar above normal levels but below the level of diabetes)



Nottingham Trent University and Aston University are investigating whether a dietary supplement can improve blood sugar control in people with prediabetes

The supplement is called beta-alanine and is found in high quantities in seafood, meat, and poultry

Participants will need to take the daily supplement for 3 months and attend the University closest to where they live on 3 occasions during this period

Are you eligible?

We are recruiting adults aged 18 to 75 years with a body mass index (BMI) between 25 to 40 kg/m²

As part of the study, we will carry out a blood test to confirm that your blood sugar is in the prediabetic range
