Forty-five members joined us at our May meeting. Kevin Reynolds gave us a truly insightful and informative talk on how our relationship with the wild birds in our garden has changed over the last 150 years. We discovered that Charles Waterton (1782-1865) invented the bird-nesting box and created the world's first wildlife sanctuary at Walton Hall near Wakefield. We were reminded that it wasn't that long ago wild birds were a source of food and were more likely to be eaten rather than fed. Among many other interesting facts, we heard about Etta Lemon's lifelong campaign against the worldwide slaughter of birds for extravagantly feathered hats and the shocking information that over 5 million birds were killed only for their feathers. Etta Lemon's legacy is the RSPB, grown from an all-female pressure group of 1889 with the pledge "Wear No Feathers". Her long battle against "murderous millinery" triumphed with the Plumage Act of 1921.
